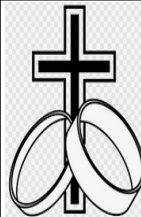


children often struggle. The young own schedules, and demanding. To help we'd like to extend a parents and children to our Friday adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, after
